FYI - Program to Spay/neuter cats: The Fix Is In is a non-profit veterinarian service that focuses on high volume spay and neuter. We are currently working to schedule several clinic dates within Wood County to fix outdoor cats for county residents FREE OF CHARGE. Cats will be altered, ear-tipped, rabies vaccinated, and given a dose of Selmection to treat fleas, ear mites, and hook and round worms.
